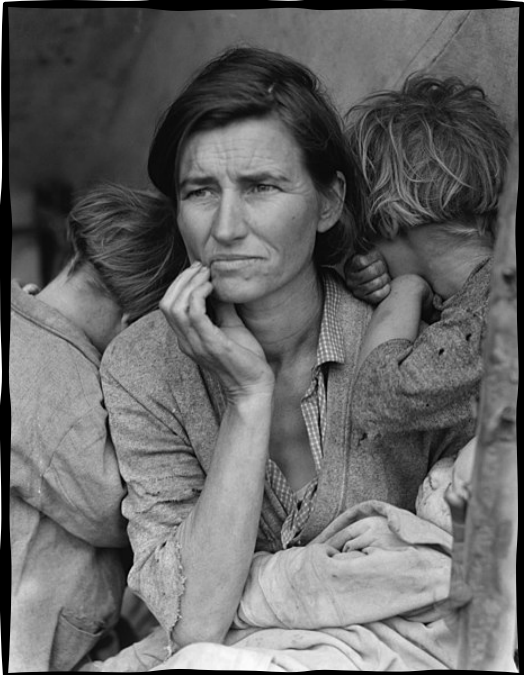
 a judge lives here	 good place for a hand-out	 doctor won't charge here

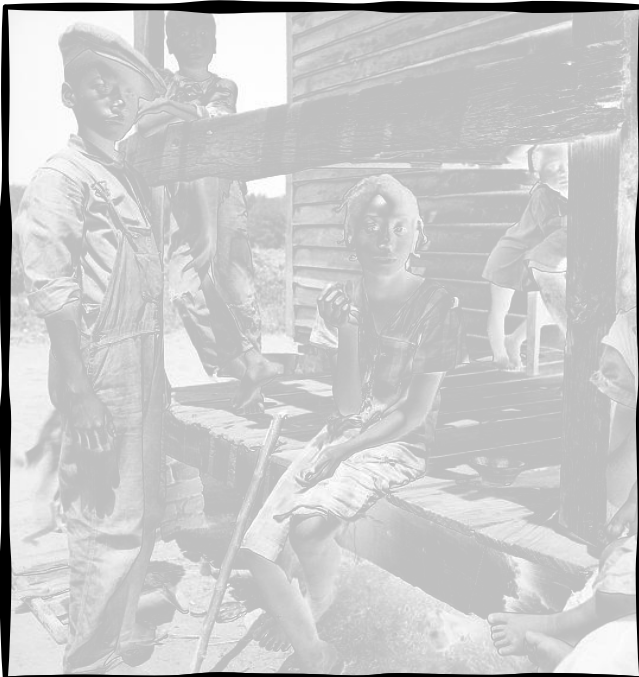
